San Antonio Area Foundation Funds Infirmary Expansion

The Humane Society SPCA of Bexar County has received a grant from the **Aid to Helpless Animals Trust of the San Antonio Area Foundation**. The total award of **\$95,000** will be used for **Enhanced Medical Rescue and Preventative Care Expansion** of our infirmary.

The purpose of our project is to create an environment where infectious animals entering the facility can be treated without cross contaminating our healthy animals. The funded expansion grant will allow us to create an infirmary yard that infectious animals can use and will also provide for the installation of ionizer units within the HVAC (Heating Ventilation and Air Conditioning) units to eliminate the transfer of airborne infectious diseases within the shelter.

Humane Society is First On the Scene After Eagle Pass Tornado

On April 25, 2007, the Humane Society SPCA of Bexar County sent 3 staff members to assess the animal situation after a classified F3 tornado struck Maverick County. The Humane Society loaded up our 2 vehicles with medical supplies, cages, food, blankets and other general supplies to care for the anticipated number of animals that needed care and assistance. This number exceeded 100 animals.

With the help of trained Humane Society volunteers and staff, direct assistance was provided to this disaster stricken area. They were there to assist with boarding, feeding, and medical care of the animals in Eagle Pass and the affected surrounding communities.

Because emergency first responders acknowledged the need and great reputation of the Humane Society staff and volunteers, our team was allowed to drive through the nor-

mally restricted and closed disaster areas during our 5 day emergency response effort there.

We sought and gathered animals that were wandering the streets, found in demolished homes, and required immediate medical care. An temporary disaster animal shelter was established so the animals would be safe, fed and cared for until the owners of the pets returned to claim them.

Our volunteers and staff learned a lot from this tragic experience in Eagle Pass and are currently planning more formal disaster response teams and protocols to ensure the in the event of a similar disaster, we will even respond more efficiently and effectively.

Our ability to respond was due to the support made through the contributions of supporters such as you. These ensure that we continue to provide the best to care, support and advocacy for our animals.

The Humane Society SPCA of Bexar County as well as other animal agencies within the community, have all made strategic plans to address this problem, and now we must work our plans to remedy the situation.

June is Adopt-A-Cat Month. We will promote Kitten Doubles Adoptions and Wacky Cat Wednesdays where cats are \$25. Adopt-A-Dog month cannot come soon enough (October). We have several older dogs that are looking for good homes. Some of their adoption fees have been already paid for through our Guardian Angel Program. Some of these dogs have also been trained by the San Antonio Dog Training Club. This means that it is possible to adopt a trained dog at now charge to you.

As animal lovers and animal advocates we must all continue to talk about and promote spaying and neutering, pet training, ID tags and microchips and set an example for pet owners who may never have been to a veterinarians office or a dog training class. The HSSPCA promotes both spay/neuter clinic programs (see box below) and all 100 plus veterinarians as part of owning a pet.
