CAMP HUMANE: CENTERED ON SERVICE

This summer, campers were abound as our Humane Education Coordinator, Shannon Sledge, hosted six sessions of Camp Humane, educating more than 200 campers! CATCHING UP WITH DR. BRIDGEMAN

This fall mosquitoes seem to be rampant across the San Antonio area and much of the southern United States. Not only are they a nuisance to us and many animals, but mosquitoes are also carriers of heartworms, which can be devastating to our dogs and cats. All it takes is one bite from an infected mosquito to transmit heartworms to your pet. Luckily, there are many forms of heartworm prevention to help keep your pet healthy. We know you are just *itching* with questions, so here is our very own Dr. Courtney Bridgeman, Shelter Veterinarian, to get you in the know about heartworms.

Q: There are so many kinds of heartworm prevention, are all created equal and how do I know which is right for my dog or cat?

A: While all the heartworm preventions have been tried and tested to be equally effective against heartworms, they all have other benefits that make them unique! Ask your veterinarian which one is right for your pet.

Q: My dog is an inside pet; does he still need heartworm prevention?

A: While it's true that an inside dog has LESS of a chance of catching heartworms than an outside dog, no pet without prevention is completely safe. Most pets spend at least a little time outside, and let's face it, how many times have you been bitten by a mosquito in the house? It only takes one infected bite on your unprotected pet to create a heartworm infection.

For the answers to the questions "My pet is on year-round heartworm prevention, is there a chance he could get infected?" and "How often should I get my pet tested for heartworms?" as well as other pet related questions, visit SAhumane.org.

Working in a shelter, sometimes there's that animal that comes through the door and makes you look twice; Tipsy was one of those dogs. When she first arrived at our shelter, Tipsy had just been rescued by a good samaritan who saw her thrown from a car. While her current plight was reason enough to cause a fuss, Tipsy was also malnourished, suffering from anemia and neglect, and was so covered in fleas that we could barely tell the true color of her face underneath the hundreds of pests that plagued her.

With no time or desire to think of her past, our staff worked quickly to help Tipsy. The first night she was with us we bathed her, combed her, fed her, loved her, and did everything in our power to show her that she was safe with us. After two weeks of continuous care, Tipsy was acting like an entirely different dog! Before she could barely lift her head to eat and two weeks later she was jumping around, playing with our staff members, and really showing off her loving personality.

Unable to leave Tipsy's story untold, we Facebooked and Tweeted all about her and it wasn't long before local news jumped on the story. Overnight her celebrity status went through the roof and everyone couldn't stop talking about Tipsy! But there was one woman in particular named Margie who saw Tipsy as something more than a dog who had been given a second chance; she saw Tipsy as the missing piece to her puzzle, a new family member that was meant to be hers.

Tipsy's story was posted on Facebook August 9th, 2012; a horrible, yet hopeful day for Margie. Earlier Margie had to say goodbye to a loved companion, a dog named Daisy who regrettably passed away. - Open from noon to 7pm every day except major holidays.
- Regular adoption fees range from \$30 to \$99.
- All animals adopted from the San Antonio Humane Society have been spayed or neutered and received their first set of vaccinations, de-wormer, and flea prevention. Cats are tested for FIV/FELV and dogs receive heartworm prevention. Both dogs and cats come with a microchip, 14 days free vet care from VCA hospitals, 30 days of free pet insurance*, a starter bag of Hill's Science Diet food, and a collar with a personalized tag.
