

Saving Stanford



Stanford, a young Retriever mix, came to the San Antonio Humane Society at the beginning of October 2017. He was found wandering the streets of San Antonio alone and in desperate need of help. It was clear that he was suffering from neglect. His coat was infested with fleas

and a cable wire had become embedded at least a half-inch deep in his neck. Our assumption is that the wire was used to prevent him from roaming as a small puppy, and as he grew the wire was never adjusted, resulting in months of pain from tissue damage and infection.

After anesthesia was given, wire cutters were used to remove the cable wire, and his neck was shaved to thoroughly examine the severity of his wound. Hydrotherapy was also provided, and our wonderful



surgery staff treated his wound with medical honey. Through the generosity of supporters like you, we had the funds needed to ensure that Stanford was well taken care of.

His wound healed within a few short weeks, and he was even featured in a special photo shoot with Red McCombs Toyota (photo above). His journey wasn't easy at first, but Stanford is living the good life now with a loving family who adores him.

Donors Deliver After Hurricane Harvey

Late last summer, when Hurricane Harvey began heading our way, our staff and volunteers immediately began preparing. Not knowing exactly what to expect, crates and cages of various sizes were put together and extra supplies were gathered.

Within hours, people fleeing the hurricane began arriving, looking for a safe place for their pets to stay. Not only did we provide shelter for these owned pets, but we also took in strays affected by the storm and made several trips to



the Gulf Coast to give out supplies and transport pets to the SAHS.

In all, over 400 additional dogs and cats were cared for at the SAHS. It was

an intense time at our shelter, but what came from this disaster was a community full of love, passion, and giving. Our back dock was often jam-packed with donations, including pet beds, blankets, food, and more that came from all over the world, which we shared with hurricane victims in devastated areas. Our Harvey's Heroes Fund was another glimpse into the hearts of pet lovers whose monetary donations made it possible for us to continue our mission.

We are thankful to everyone who donated, volunteered, fostered, and adopted those in need. Here's one fantastic testimony that we'd like to share:

"I've heard that people with children are reluctant to adopt an older dog, but that's precisely why we did! It was the best decision for us!

"We decided a 4+ year old dog would be great for us. We wanted a dog that we didn't need to spend a lot of time with correcting puppy behaviors. Between hectic school, work, and sports schedules, we wanted a dog that could just blend in to our routine. We met Gus and he was so sweet. We brought him home and fell in love with him so quickly! He knew how to go to the bathroom outside and sleep through the night, and he doesn't bark or chew or jump. He just follows us around, quietly interested in whatever we're up to.

"He goes to soccer games and happily lays by our feet. He goes on every car ride to pick up someone from school and eagerly greets the boys when they get in the car. He walks so nicely on a leash and loves all the attention from the kids at the bus stop. He gallops from room to room at night and lays his paws on everyone's beds to say good night. In the mornings, he nuzzles all the boys with his cold nose to wake them up. He seems so proud of himself after his daily rituals. His tail wags so hard that his rear end flies from side to side. He's just a mature guy who is happy to hang with us and soak up all our love and attention. We're all pretty sure he thinks his name is actually 'Good Boy!'

"For us, this easy transition to a pet is exactly what our family needed. I wonder about his history and what his life was like before. We know he came to our area after being a hurricane evacuee, but we don't know the circumstances he encountered. We're just so happy we found each other and can't even remember our days before having him with us. We just love him." – Danielle
