Humane Society Embraces Benevon Model of Sustainable Fund Raising

For the last 10 years Benavon has been training and coaching nonprofit organizations to implement mission based fund raising systems. Millions of dollars have been raised for nonprofits all around the country through this successful model. By cultivating passionate donors who are committed to the long term sustainability of the charity they love, non profits ensure their success for years to come. We knew this model could work for us so, about a year ago, a delegation of board members and senior staff from the Humane Society of San Antonio traveled to Chicago to learn about Benavon. The Humane Society team learned that with this model, over time, we could become financially self-sufficient, allowing us to do even more for the orphaned pets in our community.


Our first step in this process was to institute a "behind the scenes" tour twice a month at the Humane Society of San Antonio (tours are held on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of every month, by invitation). The tours allow our visitors to see what it really means to work at a shelter and to be confronted on a daily basis with the realities of San Antonio's pet overpopulation problems. Our visitors have been both impressed and moved by the information they gained on our tours. Secondly, we held a themed luncheon on March 4th at the Grand Hyatt San Antonio called "Seeing is Believing". At this luncheon donors were asked to pledge their support in a one-time gift, or with gifts over time. They really stepped up and the Humane Society successfully raised over \$600,000 for the animals we serve. We launched our first Humane Friends Giving Circle, which is comprised of the 55 donors who pledged a minimum of \$1,000 per year for the next 5 years.

To continue to build the relationships created or revisited with Benavon and to express our gratitude for their generosity, we are inviting supporters to participate in programs like Camp Humane and Paws in Prison graduations. At Camp Humane donors get to see our campers learn about responsible pet ownership and the various needs of companion animals. With the Paws in Prison program in Lockhart Texas, our visitors get to see Humane Society dogs graduate from an obedience program taught by the inmates. Paw in Prison is a huge benefit to the animals and the prisoners who participate. Each event shows the community and our supporters what it means to support the Humane Society and its mission.

Our family of donors is growing! With these donors and Benavon we now have a great model for sustainable fundraising that will make it possible to be self-supporting in the years to come. This is extremely important as the Humane Society is LOCALLY funded and operated without support from Humane Society of the United States, the ASPCA, or the United Way. We are truly overwhelmed by the generosity of our donors and the Grand Hyatt, our corporate underwriter who proved that "seeing is believing".

Camp Humane

Camp Humane is the only humane education camp in San Antonio where kids can learn about different types of animals while being entertained throughout the week!



Brady Girl Scout Days

This past March the Girl Scouts spent a day at the Humane Society of San Antonio learning about animal care and pet responsibility. This interactive day of activities also allowed them to earn their Brady Days badge.





Q: Are there certain dogs that should be watched more carefully during hot weather?

A: All outside dogs should be watched very carefully during the Texas summers. Long haired, short nosed, or black dogs are of specific concern during this time as they have a harder time getting rid of extra heat. Make sure that you always leave plenty of water available in a container that can't be dumped over by the dog. Many dogs have suffered from heat stroke because they accidentally knocked over their water by playing and then had nothing to drink in the middle of a hot Texas day.

Q: Why do shelters see an abundance of kittens during the summer?

A: Cats have breeding cycles that are stimulated by long hours of daylight. During the spring, as the days get longer, female cats go into "heat" and become pregnant. They carry their babies for just two months before giving birth to a litter of 4-8 kittens. Since the longer days start around March, this means that most of the early litters are born in May and continue being born through to the fall when the days start getting shorter again. A single mother cat can have up to 4 litters in one season! That's why it's so important to get your cat spayed or neutered.

Q: Does my dog need to be on heart worm prevention year round since.

I live in San Antonio?

A: Heartworms are a big deal in the South! This parasite is passed by mosquitos which, as we all know, are abundant year round in Texas and other gulf states. It is important to prevent the baby heartworms, called microfilaria, that are constantly being injected into your dog by the mosquitoes from becoming adult heartworms! Monthly prevention, either given as an edible treat or by oil placed on their skin, is very important year round here. Missing even one month could be a lost battle in the fight against heartworms, so its imperative not to lose the war!

Foster Care

Every day the Humane Society receives animals that are just shy of being ready for adoption. These animals range from orphaned kittens and puppies needing to be bottle fed, to sick or injured adults needing some TLC that only a home environment can provide.

This is where the true heroes, our volunteer foster families, step in. Our amazing foster families provide in home care for these animals from 2 weeks to a few months. Along with the love and devotion of their foster families, each animal receives the care they so desperately need to blossom and become someone's lifetime companion.

We would like to recognize and say **THANK YOU** to all of our foster families who make it possible for these animals to have a chance at a loving, forever homes.

Letter from the Director Kathryw Biw

Dear Friends,

We believe like you do, that each animal is precious and we are proud to be a No Kill Shelter where every adoptable and treatable dog and cat in our care is saved. In 2009 we took in 5000 animals with a 95% save rate, one of the highest in the nation. (our statistics are on our website under "About Us" click the Maddies link). The 5000 animals came in not only from good Samaritans, but also from adoption transfers from 33 other agencies, some of which have to euthanize to make space. We are working hard to make a difference.



Another focus this year is our education and spay /neuter programs. These programs along with our adoptions will help San Antonio overcome the serious problems we face in the areas of irresponsible pet ownership and overpopulation. Our education program is expanding to year round services. This was made possible by a recent, generous gift from the Coates Foundation. Look for our new education offerings this fall on our website www.sahumane.org. Our goal to do inhouse and public spay neuter surgeries is a reality. Our surgery suite is busy 6 days a week! We offer a unique service of public appointments on the weekends. We are grateful for the low income funding made possible by the City of San Antonio and an anonymous donor to the San Antonio Area Foundation. Our vision to have a shelter medicine hospital is in the future and this surgery suite is a stop gap measure but necessary intermediate part of our plans.

We are grateful to all our Humane Society supporters. Your gifts of time and dollars make a difference. Thank you again for your generous support and friendship. With your help we are on our way to better and brighter future for San Antonio's animals!
