SA Humane Puppy Ready for Adoption after Amputation

San Antonio, TX- The San Antonio Humane Society has performed surgery on one of its puppies to help make its life better. Albany, a 3 month old retriever mix will now have a chance at a happier and healthier life after surgery. Albany was born with an underdeveloped front leg; she is without a right front paw which causes her to walk unbalanced. The lack of padding on that foot causes pain for her when she uses it to rebalance herself.

Albany transferred from Animal Care Services on June 21st as a part of the partnership between the two organizations. She has made a full recovery and will be ready for adoption on the 21st of July.
