16 Medical Rescue Pets Fill SAHS Rehabilitation Wing: San Antonio Humane Society & Animal Care Services Work Together to Save More Lives

(Monday, February 4) The San Antonio Humane Society (SAHS) currently has their Rehabilitation Wing full with 16 pets in need of some form of medical attention, and are pleased to say that every one of them will be treated with the of best care thanks to generous supporters, tireless SAHS staff, and the successful partnership with Animal Care Services(ACS). Ranging from something as simple as needing to gain a few pounds to more serious issues like a broken pelvis, SAHS staff provides customized individual medical care for each pet in need.

Of the 16 pets, 7 of them were transferred from ACS. SAHS and ACS are working together to make sure as many pets as possible have the opportunity to find their forever loving homes through shelter adoption, where pets have already been spay or neutered and they have been given a second chance at a new life. Since October 2012, 760 pets have been transferred from ACS to SAHS and the city's live release rate has grown to XX%. It is only by working together and helping all pets, especially those in need of extra medical attention, that San Antonio will reach its goal of becoming a no-kill city.
