San Antonio, TX (December 2, 2014) – Today is Giving Tuesday, and as homeless pets wait patiently for their forever home, you can help. Your contribution on #GivingTuesday can help San Antonio Humane Society pets in a variety of ways:



\$25 = Funds our Point of Entry Screening/Vaccines (Heartworm test, DHPPC, Bordetella, Wormer, 1 Advantage dose, FIV/FLV, FVRCP) for 1 pet.

\$50 = All pets are spayed/neutered before adoption. This will provide 1 spay/neuter for 1 pet.

\$75 = All pets are micro chipped before adoption. This will fund 11 microchips for 11 pets.

\$150 = Each year, approximately 150 Heartworm cases are treated at the SAHS. This will fund 1 treatment for 1 dog.

\$500 = The average stay for pets at the SAHS is 2 weeks. This will fund shelter, care, and food for 1 animal during their stay.
