30+ SAHS Dogs To Be Transported Up North



SA, TX (September 6, 2017) The San Antonio Humane Society (SAHS) is getting ready to wave goodbye to 30+ dogs tomorrow morning. They will be making their way to various shelters up north via a transport vehicle provided by, New Leash On Life, based in Tennessee.

Thanks to the Mike Curb Family Foundation, Snooty Giggles Dog Rescue, and Animalia Health and Wellness, these pups, some who have been at the SAHS for quite some time and others who were recently transferred from the coast, will soon find a new forever home.

Courtney Curb Childress, the Mike Curb Family Foundation Director, states, *"I am so excited to partner with the San Antonio Humane Society, to give dogs a chance to find homes up north where pet overpopulation is less of a problem. This is a wonderful opportunity to shine a light on the SAHS' proactive leadership and collaborative efforts in the wake of Hurricane Harvey and we look forward to a continued partnership."*

Hurricane Harvey Update:

As of August 25, the SAHS has rescued, temporarily sheltered, and/or transferred over 320 dogs and cats from devastated areas affected by the storm. The SAHS has also provided medical and general supplies to those in need in Corpus Christi, Rockport, Ingleside, the Houston area, etc.

The SAHS is determined to continue its mission and provide assistance to pets in need. For those looking to help assist the SAHS's Hurricane Harvey relief efforts, donations are being accepted through the Harvey's Heroes Emergency Fund at SAhumane.org/hurricane-harvey. This fund will help the SAHS offset growing expenses as they continue to shelter, care for, and medically treat pet evacuees, strays, and transfer pets.
