Spots Still Available for FREE Spay/Neuter Surgeries

Eligible Zip Code Residents Qualify for Free Services at the Brooks Spay/Neuter Clinic



SA, TX (December 4, 2018) - The San Antonio Humane Society (SAHS) is hosting a FREE Spay/Neuter Transport event at Arnold Park (1011 Gillette Blvd, 78224) on Saturday, December 8 for San Antonio residents living in the following zip codes: 78201, 78202, 78203, 78204, 78207, 78208, 78210, 78211, 78212, 78213, 78214, 78218, 78220, 78221, 78222, 78223, 78224, 78225, 78227, 78228, 78235, 78237, & 78242.

Qualifying residents needing to spay/neuter their pet may do so by [scheduling online](#). Residents who require assistance with scheduling or who do not have access to a computer may call 210-424-7595 for further information.

The SAHS will transport pets from the pick-up location at Arnold Park to the Brooks Spay/Neuter Clinic (8034 City Base Landing, 78235) for their scheduled surgery.

Spay/Neuter surgeries help improve the quality of life of the altered pet by lowering the chances of certain cancers, prostate problems, and roaming. Spay/Neuter surgeries also help reduce the stray pet overpopulation by preventing unwanted and homeless litters.

Although the surgery is FREE, the SAHS is requiring a \$10 refundable deposit at the time of scheduling for each pet to help decrease no-shows and last-minute cancellations. A \$7 rabies vaccination and \$7 microchip will also be offered.
