San Antonio, TX (April 29, 2014) – What a morning! Between 9am-12pm, the SAHS welcomed more than 35 puppies, cats and kittens, some of who are ready to find loving homes and others who will be going into foster homes until they are ready for adoption. And we're not done yet, about 15 more will be joining our dedicated staff and volunteers later this afternoon. The SAHS strives to shelter, medically treat, rehabilitate and find homes for as many dogs, cats, puppies and kitties as possible. In 2013, 4,961 animals were adopted from the SAHS and our passion of finding forever homes for thousands of adoptable pets keeps increasing each year.

In order to continue to give these animals a second chance, as a non-profit organization we rely heavily on generous donations from the public. Therefore, the SAHS will be participating in <u>The Big Give S.A.</u>, a 24-hour day of giving that will take place from midnight to midnight on Tuesday, May 6, 2014. This community-wide giving challenge will increase awareness of the impact local nonprofits make in our community, and will connect people to the causes that move them the most. By turning giving into a shared city-wide experience, we can significantly impact the future of San Antonio and collectively move our city forward.

With a goal of becoming a no-kill city and a plan to expand our ability to aid homeless pets by adding a shelter medicine hospital to our campus, the San Antonio Humane Society appreciates any and all donations!
