# Petco Foundation Invests \$45k in Life Saving Services provided by the San Antonio Humane Society Grant will Increase Access to Essential Spay/Neuter Surgeries for Needy Pets

**SA, TX** (June 1, 2018) – The San Antonio Humane Society (SAHS) has been awarded a \$45,000 grant from the Petco Foundation to support the nonprofit's efforts to help decrease the stray overpopulation in San Antonio and its surrounding areas.

Funds will provide an estimated 1,000 discounted spay/neuter surgeries at the Brooks Spay/Neuter Clinic, currently operated by the SAHS.

"Thanks to the funds granted to us by the Petco Foundation, we will be able to provide even more opportunities for residents who are looking to improve the lives of their pets," said SAHS President/CEO, Nancy May.

Although the spay/neuter clinic is located in the city's south side, low-cost services will be available for all residents of San Antonio and its surrounding areas.

"The biggest way we can decrease the pet overpopulation in San Antonio," said SAHS Spay/Neuter Program Manager, Danika Linares, "is by providing pet sterilizations for responsible owners with limited funds."

In 2017 the SAHS was able to conduct over 15,000 spay/neuter surgeries for San Antonio and its neighboring communities.
