Retriever rescued with embedded collar wound ready for adoption

SAN ANTONIO – Dec. 10, 2021 - A 2-year-old Retriever mix pup arrived at the San Antonio Humane Society (SAHS) on Nov. 30 with a neck wound caused by an embedded collar. After receiving the love and care she needed, she's bounced back and ready to find her forever home!

The pup was named Snow White because of her beautiful white coat. By the looks of her, you may never suspect this sweet girl had a severe wound that was likely the result of neglect or abuse. She most likely had to endure pain most of her life. Still, Snow White wags her tail and is playful and friendly.

"Snow White received laser therapy and daily cleanings for her embedded collar wound every day," SAHS Associate Veterinarian Dr. Leslie Hopes said. "She will need to be walked on a harness until her neck is fully healed. She's a super sweet lady!"

Snow White is now available for adoption at the SAHS. She's a happy pup who doesn't seem to be traumatized at all. She loves to play and will show you her big, beautiful smile. Her fur is still growing back around her neck, but she'll continue to improve in a loving home. If you would like to adopt Snow White, stop by and meet her today.
