Reduced and Waived Adoption Fees for Cats, Kittens, Adult Dogs, and Senior Pets *Adoptable Pets at the San Antonio Humane Society Ready for Good Homes during Specials*



SA, TX (October 24, 2018) – This Saturday and Sunday may be the perfect opportunity to visit the San Antonio Humane Society (SAHS) if you are in search of a new fur-ever family member.

Cats, kittens, adult dogs, and senior pets will have reduced or waived adoption fees thanks to three adoption events coinciding during this paw-sitively exciting weekend:

- Sosy's Spooktacular Adoption Special: Saturday through Sunday, October 27-28, all cat and kitten adoption fees will be waived thanks to Sosy the cat and her parents who want Sosy's feline friends to find loving forever homes—just like she did!
- October PUP-kin Adoption Special: Through the end of October, adult dogs (8 months or older) have a reduced adoption fee of \$25.
- Senior for Seniors Adoption Special: Seniors (65 years or older) who adopt a senior pet (6 years or older) from the SAHS on Saturday, October 27 will benefit from waived adoption fees. Thanks to Always Best Care San Antonio for supporting seniors in our community.

All adoption packages include each pet's spay/neuter surgery, first set of vaccinations, microchip, collar, tag, and more. Potential adopters will be required to go through the usual adoption process with our staff.
