Humane Society Takes Steps to Decrease Pet Overpopulation

The Humane Society/SPCA of Bexar County has expanded our medical services to include on site pre-adoption spays and neuters.



HSSPCA Surgery Suite with veterinarian conducting spays and neuters.

We purchased a mobile surgery suite and began surgeries this June. Approximately 1400 **preadoption** spays and neuters have been performed by the SNAP surgery team at the Humane Society since the initiation of the program.

In addition to surgeries, the team also microchips each animal and vaccinates all dogs and cats over 3 months of age for Rabies.

To decrease the overpopulation problem, it is vital that all shelters alter pets before releasing



Did you know, one pair of breeding cats, with all their offspring, will generate 420,000 kittens in just six years? Two breeding dogs with their offspring will produce 67,000 puppies in seven years!



Power in Numbers



There is a saying: "there is power in numbers". Cynthia Martinez, Shelter Manager, recently experienced such power. One day while tackling the normal day to day shelter challenges a co worker asked her "How many animals do you think you have personally found homes for?" This question momentarily stumped her but after some thought she was able to respond.

She realized that she had worked in the adoption department of the Humane Society for almost 6 years. On an average day she per-

sonally adopted out 6-7 animals, sometimes 10 or more on a busy day. Therefore she concluded 8 adoptions per day would be a good average for a 5 day week. Keep in mind these are only her personal totals and did not include the other 3-5 counselors on duty on any given day.

She went on to estimate that 8 adoptions a day for 5 days over a 50 week period, deducting holidays and the occasional sick day would be a good number. Then she realized that past year and a half, her supervisory duties de-



crease her ability to find homes for animals. Therefore, she used only 4.5 years in her calculations. She was astonished when she realized that she had been personally responsible for finding homes for 9,000 animals.

She then pooled other staff members to assess their numbers. The responses varied from the hundreds to the tens of thousands. It was evident that once the staff performed this exercise they all became recharged and exhilarated.

If all of our staff members, volunteers and supporters took the time to calculate how their individual efforts impact the welfare of the animals provided services by the Humane Society, it would become clear that there is truly power in numbers.

Photography Team



Is taking pictures your passion? We need your help to get our pet's furry faces on our website in the Virtual Shelter. Volunteers will sign out a digital camera and be scheduled for a specific day each week.

Outreach Team

Want to help us out on the road? Assist the Outreach Coordinator at adoption outreaches held at local PetCo and PetSmart stores as well as events held with the SPURS and Botanical Gardens (to name a few). If you are energetic and responsible, you are the ideal candidate. You must be at least 16 years of age and have volunteered at the shelter for at least 10 hours. You must also be willing to be scheduled for specific days and work on weekends.

Adoption Team

Learn the adoption process and be able to assist the Adoption Counselors. Interview potential new fami-



lies for our shelter pets. You must be at least 18, volunteered at the shelter for at least 10 hours and be willing to be scheduled for specific days and work on weekends.

Infirmary Team

Our Infirmary can hold over 40 animals at one time and they all need extra special care. They have to be walked in specific areas on the campus twice a day, have their cages specially cleaned, and more than anything, need to be socialized and loved.

The infirmary is an isolated room at our facility so animals there do not see as many people as our other residents. If you want to be a member of this team, you must willing to work ONLY in this area the days you are scheduled to work.

After Hours Team

Did you know that some of the Humane Society Staff work on the campus well after we close our doors to the public? After 7pm we still need your help.

If your are a night owl (and give a hoot), 18 years of age and would like to help out between the hours of 6:30pm and 9:30pm, this might be the opportunity for you. You must be willing to be scheduled specific days.




