

San Antonio Spur, Tony Parker, makes a visit



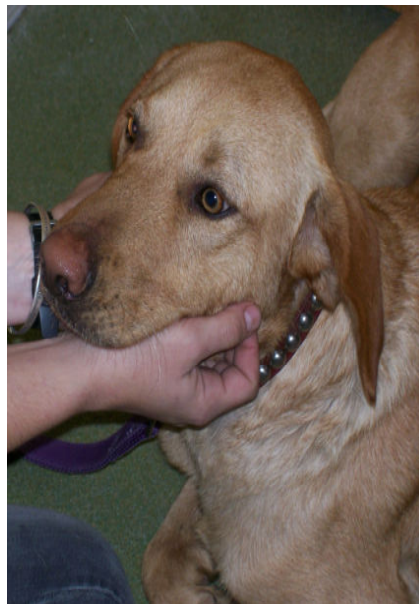

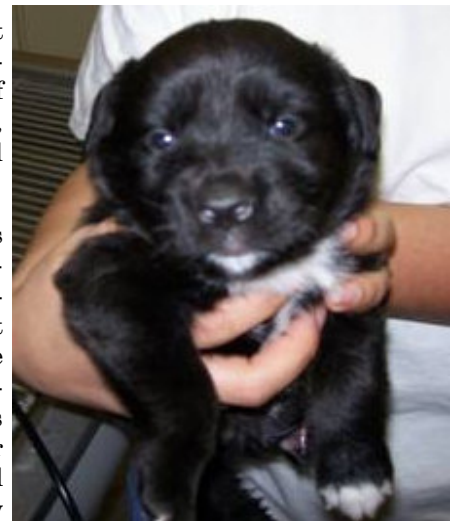
Tough Beginnings, Happier Endings

The latter part of 2007 and the start of 2008 brought many different stories to the Humane Society, two of which, Riley, the Rubber-Band dog, and Parker the mutilated puppy, had their share of hard times.

Riley, a 2-year-old retriever, was found after his previous owner attempted an "at-home" castration procedure. The affected area was left with severe infection and tissue death. His need for immediate medical attention was obvious and he was brought into the Humane Society for treatment. Riley was treated and will be in foster care until he is ready to be adopted to his new home. Riley is another HS/SPCA success story!

Parker came to us at 5-weeks-old riddled with infection and too weak to move. Another dog had bitten off his left hind leg and tail. Parkers' owners were unable to seek medical help for him for 3 days. They surrendered him to us and we immediately sent him to the vet. After surgery, rehabilitation, many weeks of rehabilitation and foster care, Parker was able to be put up for adoption. He went to a wonderful home and has a brand new start on life. Parker is just one of the over 650 dogs and cats that we fostered last year and over 240 dogs and cats that we provided medical rescue for.

Dear Friends,

The GOAL is to have every "adoptable pet adopted".

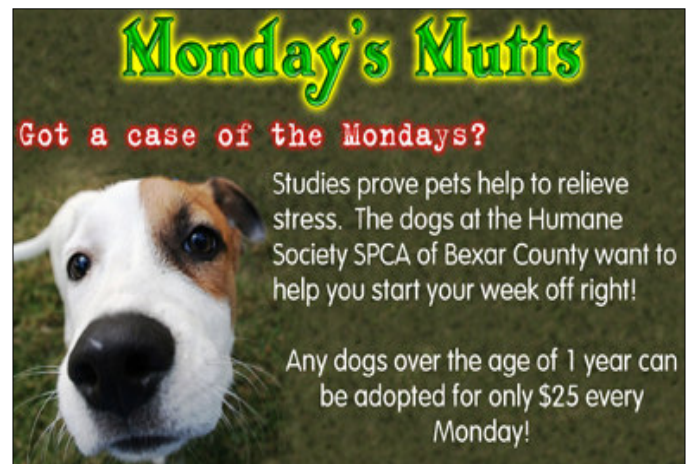

Dog Whisperer invites HSSPCA dog to be guest



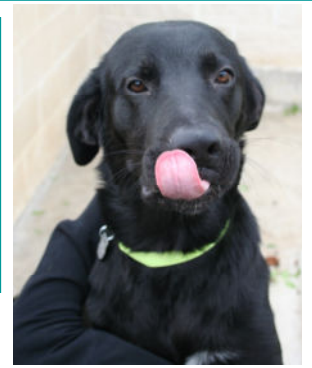

Help Rescue a Pet

At the Humane Society SPCA of Bexar County, we make every effort to find the best home for the pets in our care. Sadly, many of the dogs and cats that come to us have been abused or neglected and others are injured or have chronic illnesses. These injured or ill animals are treated based on the funds available at the time of intake or illness.

Through our **Veterinarian Medical Rescue Program**, you can choose to make a one time or monthly contribution for a dog or cat with special needs. This will defray the costs associated with the provision of necessary medical care they need and deserve. Once these animals are healthy, they will then be available to the public for adoption.



Persian and Himalayan Rescue Mission Successful

On January 14, 2008, The Humane Society and Animal Care Services partnered together to remove over 90 Persian and Himalayan cats from a woman's home. These purebred cats were used for breeding purposes and kept in cages housed in her garage.



The Humane Society transferred most of the cats and kittens from the old ACS facility to the Humane Society on Fredericksburg Rd. Once the cats and kittens were received at the Humane Society, they were evaluated, given vaccinations, dewormed, bathed and made comfortable in the special needs wing of the shelter. The

momma cats with kittens will be in their own maternity suite. Due to the condition of their badly matted coats, they all needed to be shaved down. All will be spayed and neutered.

It will be some time before any of these purebred cats will be available for adoption. If anyone would like to make financial contributions to the Humane Society to offset the expenses incurred related to the rehabilitation, please visit our website at www.humanesocietyspca.org.

Rescued Dogs from Corpus Christi



In January 2008, the Humane Society transferred 20 dogs from Corpus Christi Animal Care to help in a horrific dog hoarding case. Over 230 dogs that were housed at a woman's home for breeding purposes were seized. The Pomeranians and other small dogs were extremely matted and in need of medical care. The HS/SPCA evaluated the dogs and treated them for various medical issues. They were also spayed or neutered, micro chipped, and given vaccinations and dentals before they were adopted out. The Humane Society is committed to collaborating with other animal organizations in and around the city to reduce animal hoarding and abuse cases.



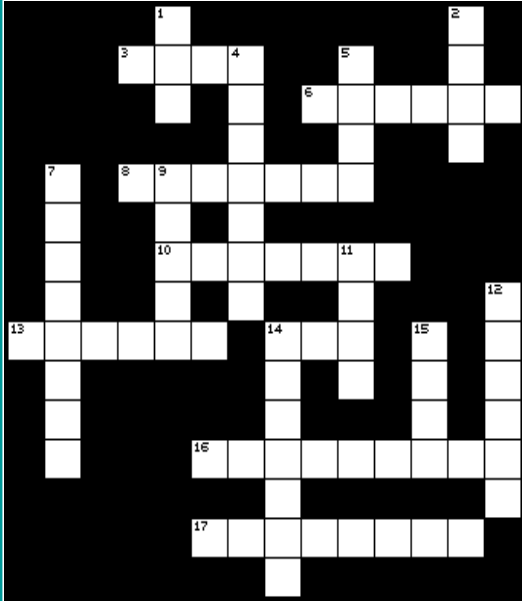
Camp Humane

\$10,000 raised towards Abuse & Cruelty Reward Fund

The Humane Society SPCA of Bexar County Abuse & Cruelty Reward Fund was started in November 2007 on the Humane Society website in response to the overwhelming support toward the injustices that happened in the city starting in October 2007. The HS/SPCA received \$1,000 from the Animal Defense League, \$2,500 from the Humane Society of the United States, and the rest from private donors.

Over 10 cats were found mutilated in different areas of the city over a few months. The Humane Society teamed up with the Animal Care Services to canvas a neighborhood that was hardest hit. The goal was to educate people in that area of the cat mutilations. The reward fund is now a permanent fixture on the HS/SPCA website and will be ongoing for future help in prosecution of a person responsible for animal cruelty. The Humane Society was featured on the National Geraldo Rivera Show in October and a syndicated radio show in November dealing with the issue of animal cruelty in San Antonio.

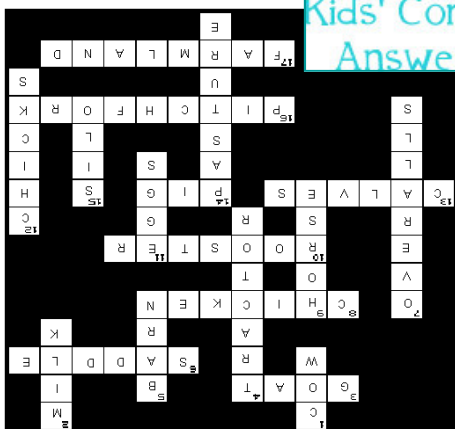

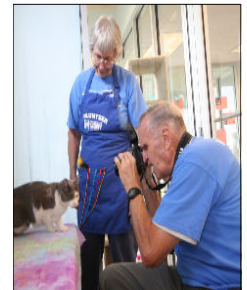
