Over the 15+ years I had her, she brought the deepest happiness to my life & was deeply loved by all who met her. She loved to hike, trail run, bike, kayak, camp, go to bars, concerts, the river, the ocean, & everywhere in between. She had a very, very full life & made mine all the richer.

A few years ago her kidneys started to shut down, we got her on supplements & kept her quality of life up as much as possible. The attached video was from late January of last year, over a year & a half into her kidney failure. She was still happy & running at 15! November 2022 we had to say goodbye, her quality had gotten too poor & I didn't want her to suffer. The news rippled through my community & an outpouring of love hit the shore of her absence. I know many people donated to your shelter & others on behalf of her life.

I wanted to take a moment to reach out & share the happy, wonderful, immensely big existence one of the dogs from your shelter got to have. I am forever grateful that she found me & I'm sure many dogs leave & you never know how they fared, but now that I close out that chapter of my life with her I wanted to let you know that at least one dog from your walls was the happiest I could make her.
